4. **YouTube Live:** It is not a direct learning method; the student can record and upload the teacher's speech at a time of his choice. Can. This is the largest video sharing site. Anyone can create a channel using their designated account. It has a private option that can only be shown to designated students. Once again, the video can be premiered at the scheduled time of the course by uploading all the videos at once. This is an excellent teaching medium based online.

6. **Team Viewer:** It is a small medium for conducting online based classes. To use it, the teacher invites the students with the prescribed passcode and takes the class in a convenient manner.

7. **Google applications:** In addition to the Google classroom, Google has a number of other popular applications that can be used to easily manage class activities directly. Famous among these are G-suit, G-meet, Hangout, Duo etc.

8. **K-12 Education (k-12 education):** It is an Apple application that can be used for effective teaching. This is a favorite application of students.

9. **Flashback Express:** In addition to the presentation on the content screen created by Flashback Express, the teacher's lecture on the subject can also be viewed live in the online class using the application called Flashback Express.

10. **Social Media Apps:** Social media is now one of the main means by which teachers and students can comfortably run class activities. Not only that, most of the non-school-college-university teachers 'organizations, especially the All India Teachers' Organization (AIFOCTO) and the All India Save Education Committee, a platform of the All India Education Movement, and various central student organizations have termed the system as discriminatory. According to them, the online education system has brought some success in a handful of higher education institutions like IITs and ISARs and in established private

As a result, it is not possible to build the minimum infrastructure required for online education And we have all come to realize the dire deterioration of school education as a result of the failure of government and government-run schools to pass up to eighth grade in the name of continuous assessment without building the minimum infrastructure. Discrimination and inequality among students has increased in education In this case too, it is likely to happen again however, the Union Minister for Human Resource Development recently spoke of introducing the ancient Vedic education system, as well as digital education. They will tell you how to match the two, but we ordinary people will see that the online education and examination system will deprive the students from the homes of the poor. There are no laptops or good Android phones in the homes of the poor, in urban areas and especially in rural areas.

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
